The Huntington Library, Art Museum, and Botanical Gardens is a collections-based research and Educational Institution. Its mission is to share its world-renown collections to support scholarship, foster learning, inspire creativity, and offer transformative experiences for diverse audiences.

Henry Edwards Huntington was a railroad and real estate businessman. He purchased the San Marino Ranch (the site of The Huntington Library) in 1903. He and his wife, Arabella Duval Huntington, amassed an extensive collection of books, art and botanical specimens. In 1919, they executed a trust document to transform their private collection into a public institution “to promote the public welfare.” After Henry and his wife passed away, The Huntington opened to the public in 1928. Among their collections are a manuscript of Chaucer’s *The Canterbury Tales*, a copy on vellum of the Gutenberg *Bible*, and an original manuscript of Benjamin Franklin’s autobiography. Henry Huntington joined the Society of Colonial Wars in 1915 (CA#144).

Parking:

There is Complimentary Parking on site at The Huntington. The Huntington is located near Pasadena in the city of San Marino, twelve miles northeast of downtown Los Angeles. Please use The Huntington entrance gate at 1800 Orlando Road, at the junction of S. Allen Avenue and Orlando Road.

What to see:

Following the meeting, attendees are encouraged to view the exhibitions of rare materials in the Library Exhibition Hall, the grand manner portraits and exquisite objects of art in the Huntington Art Gallery and Scott Galleries of American Art, the botanical conservatory, and acres of spectacular gardens.
